

Conservation of the Long-fingered bat

Clean waters of our karstic rivers and the protection of the caves in which it dwells are the prerequisites for the survival of this species!



The Long-fingered Bat / *Myotis capaccinii* is one of the most endangered species in Croatia and the world. It feeds on insects by collecting them off the water surface with its long feet, but it hunts in the air as well. The majority of these insects mature in the water of the karstic rivers. The abundance of the females with young in the caves near rivers serves also as an indicator of water quality.

The project »Conservation of the Long-fingered Bat for the protection of the karstic habitat in Croatia« is being implemented since 2007 by the Croatian Biospeleological Society with the financial support of the Whitley Fund for Nature, State Institute for Nature Protection, Environmental Protection and Energy Efficiency Fund and the Ministry of Culture.
